#### As a STEM Squire, You have the right to:

- ✓ Be treated fairly and with respect by all members of the school community.
- ✓ Attend a safe school where people will not deliberately hurt you.
- ✓ Hear and be heard in class.
- Express your feelings and opinions in a polite manner, at the appropriate time, without being interrupted or punished.
- ✓ Expect the school community to Value your heritage.
- ✓ Feel good about yourself while in school.

#### As a STEM Squire, you have the responsibility to:

- ✓ Take ownership of your learning, working to your full potential.
- ✓ Take ownership of your actions understanding that violation of the Code of Conduct will require a response.
- ✓ Listen while others are talking.
- ✓ Respect school property and the personal property of others.
- ✓ Be inclusive and welcoming to peers.
- ✓ Be kind and respectful of all members of the STEM Academy.

If you choose to ignore the rights of others or if you choose to ignore your responsibilities the Code of Conduct will guide a collaborative response to your behavior.
